

Wilfried GRAF is a senior researcher at the Centre for Peace Research and Peace Education at the Alpen-Adria-University of Klagenfurt. He holds a PhD in Sociology. He is co-founder of the Institute for Integrative Peacebuilding and Conflict Transformation Vienna (IICP), today Herbert C. Kelman Institute for Interactive Conflict Transformation (HKI), with associates in Vienna, Jerusalem and Ramallah. As of 2012 he is the executive director of the Kelman Institute. From 1983 to 2005 he was researcher at the Austrian Study Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution (ASPR) in Stadtschlaining / Austria. From 2006 – 2011 he was senior researcher at the Institute for the Sociology of Law and Criminology in Vienna. He has been working also as an adviser and trainer in conflict regions and post-conflict societies, in particular in the Balkans, Sri Lanka, South Caucasus and Central Asia. Today his activities are focusing primarily on Israel/ Palestine. From 2002 – 2010 Dr. Graf was engaged in the support of the peace process in Sri Lanka as co-facilitator on Track 1 ½ on behalf of the Austrian Ministry for Foreign Affairs. He is lecturer and trainer at several universities and has co-developed a specific approach to “interactive conflict transformation”, integrating the approach of “Complexity Thinking” (Edgar Morin) and the interactional approach of “Interactive Problem Solving” (Herbert C. Kelman).
